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Relief for Taxpayers Extended to Mariposa County

Sacramento – Business owners and feepayers impacted by the "Rim Fire" in Mariposa County, as discussed in this Proclamation of a State of Emergency, may request an extension to file their returns, relief of penalties and/or interest from some taxes and fees, or to replace copies of records lost to damage, announced the California State Board of Equalization.

"We want people whose lives and businesses have been adversely impacted by this devastating fire to know we are here to help so they don't have to worry about taxes during this trying time," said Board of Equalization Member George Runner. "This includes taxpayers who can't pay their fire fee bills because they've had to evacuate from their homes."

Board of Equalization records indicate there about 600 businesses registered in Mariposa County, and 8,160 individuals who will receive Fire Fee bills.

Requesting Relief

Tax and feepayers can go online to request relief from penalty and/or interest, and an extension of time to file a tax/fee return.
