WHEREAS, according to the <u>U.S. Small Businesses Administration</u>, in 2018, there were more than 3.9 million small businesses in California employing 7 million people, making up more than 99 percent of all firms in California, and around half of the private workforce; and

WHEREAS, small businesses comprise more than 70% of the employees in such vital California economic sectors such as construction, services, real estate, agriculture, forestry and fishing; and
