WHEREAS, the California State Board of Equalization is committed to supporting California's goal to contract three percent of contract dollars with Disabled Veterans Business Enterprise (DVBE); and

WHEREAS, California is the state with the <u>most veteran-owned firms</u>, estimated at more than 250,000, which has resulted in more than \$135 billion in sales; and

WHEREAS, the State of California is honored to employ many current and former service members and veterans of the United States Armed Forces and provides a Veterans' Preference assistance program for those who seek employment with the State; and

WHEREAS, the California State Board of Equalization is committed to partnering with local County Assessors to raise awareness of the <u>Veterans' Exemption</u> and <u>Disabled Veterans' Exemption</u> to support veterans, their families, and caregivers to reduce their property tax liability; and

WHEREAS, 53,003 Disabled Veterans' Exemptions valued at more than \$7 billion dollars were claimed by eligible disabled veterans in 2019; and

WHEREAS, the California State Board of Equalization encourages veterans and military families to contact their local County Assessors to take advantage of their <u>property tax options</u>, therefore:
