WHY WE WENT VIRTUAL?

- COVID-19 pandemic caused the closure of LA County facilities to the public.
- Open appeals applications increased from 25,507 to 34,965, 37% increase from the prior year.
- LA County commenced hearings virtually using WebEx, a web conferencing communication platform, and developed the custom-built Assessment Appeals Portal (AAP) for evidence submission online.
- LA County conducted its first virtual hearing on October 19, 2020.





VIRTUAL HEARING BENEFITS

- Safety of applicants without the need for in-person contact by allowing applicants to attend hearings using a PC, laptop, tablet or any smart device with internet service in convenient locations.
- Convenient online evidence upload capability without the need to spend time and money on making several photocopies of hundreds of exhibits.
- More accessibility and efficiency.
- Eliminate commute time, gas consumption, and parking fees incurred when appearing in-person.
- High audio/video quality of hearing recordings.





RESOLVED CONCERNS

Right to In-Person Hearings:

• LA County AAB allows applicants to request an in-person hearing in lieu of a virtual hearing.

Evidence Submission:

- Evidence submission at least 2 days prior to the hearing date via LA County's AAP, allowing both parties to view and download evidence at hearing
 - For taxpayers who do not have capabilities to digitize or electronically submit their evidence,
 document may be sent to AAB at least 1 week prior to the hearing for digitization.
- Ability to upload rebuttal evidence at hearing.
- Simultaneous viewing available for comparison of documents.

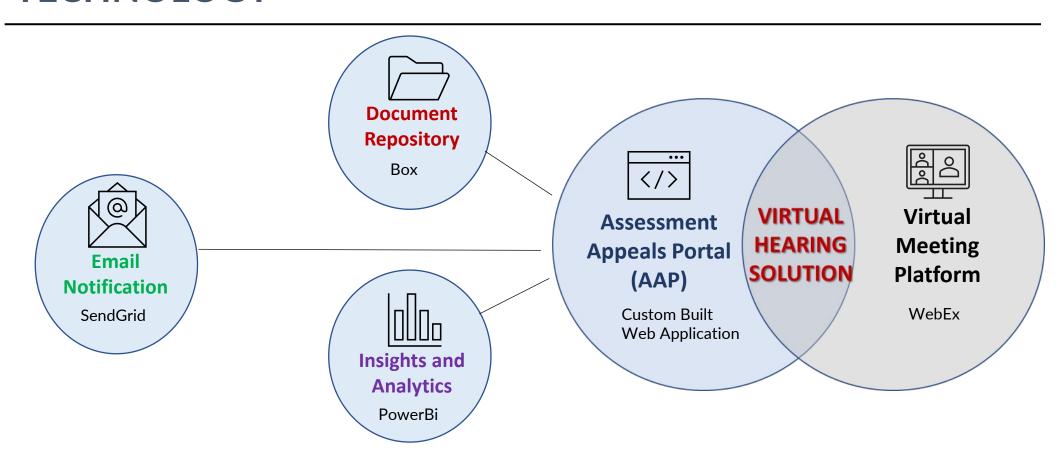
Increased efficiencies in hearing proceedings:

- Increased AAB member availability for hearings
- Hearings start promptly as scheduled
- Use of "breakout rooms" for private discussions and deliberations

Communication/Outreach

- Informative videos and video tutorials are available on our website and accessible on YouTube
- Public Education Seminar (via WebEx) is hosted monthly by AAB
- Informative flyer is enclosed with mailed hearing appointment cards
- Email notifications for WebEx meeting invitation

Training/Connectivity Test

- Trainings were provided to AAB Members, Hearing Officers, AAB staff, and Assessor's staff
- Practice/dry run available for interested taxpayers and tax agents

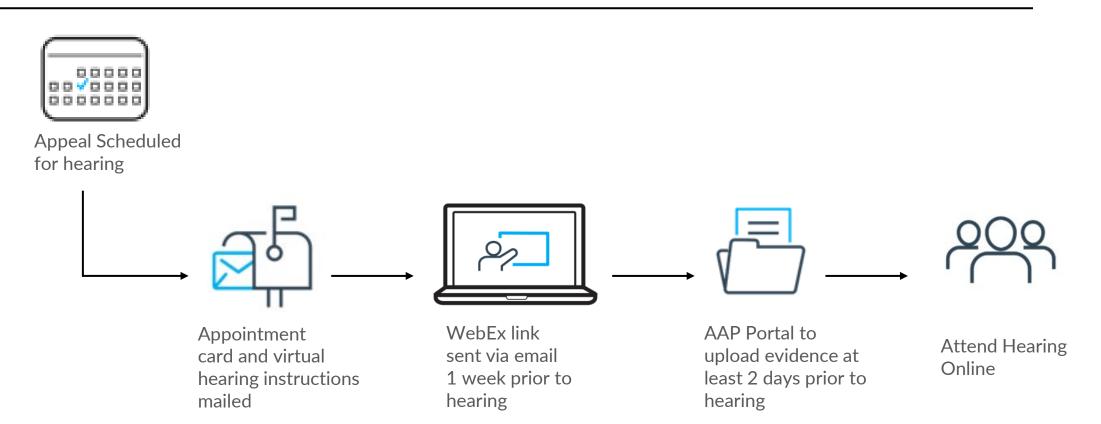
Web-Conferencing Room

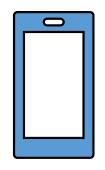

3) Select your hearing/case to upload your evidence

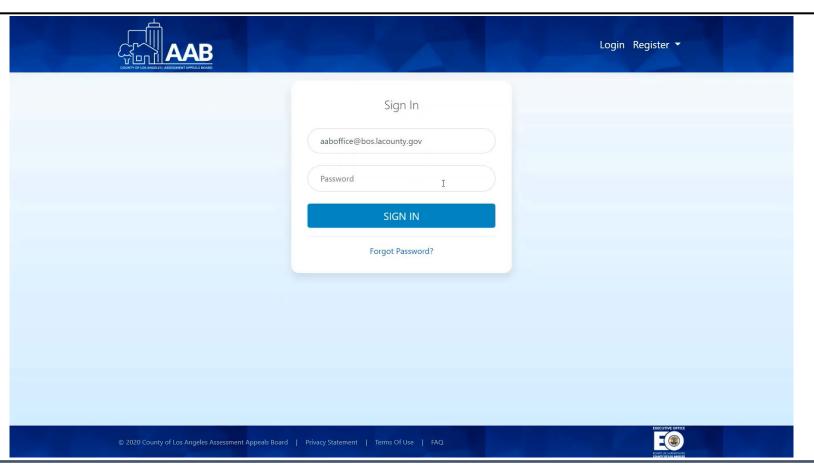


4) Upload your evidence





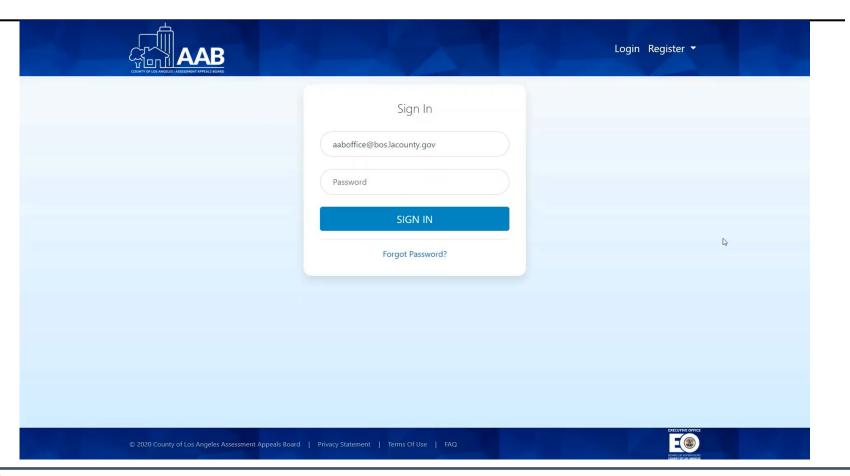

VIEWING/SAVING DOCUMENTS AT HEARING

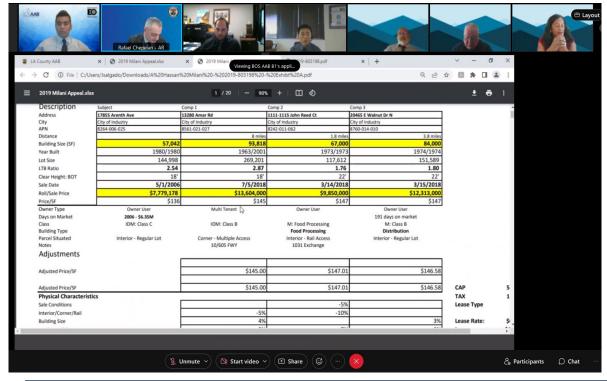


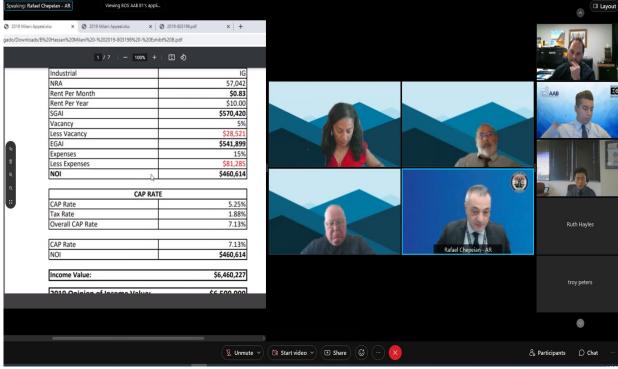




DAY OF THE HEARING

- Participant has ability to modify their WebEx view of documents and participants

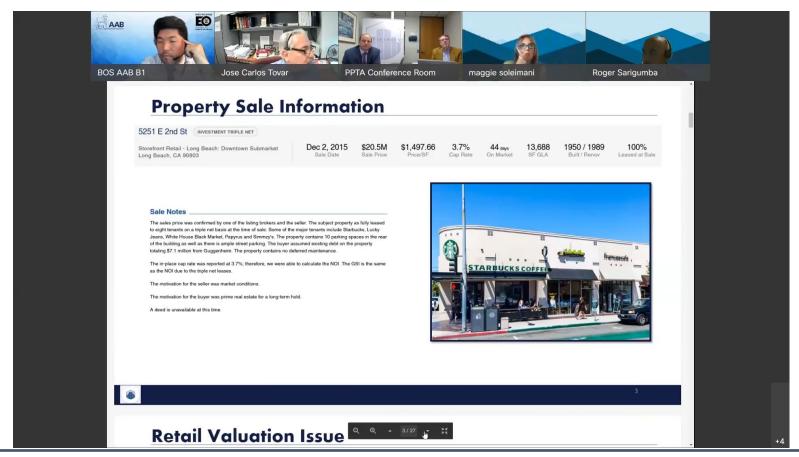








SAMPLE VIRTUAL HEARINGS- AGENT AND APPLICANT TESTIMONY







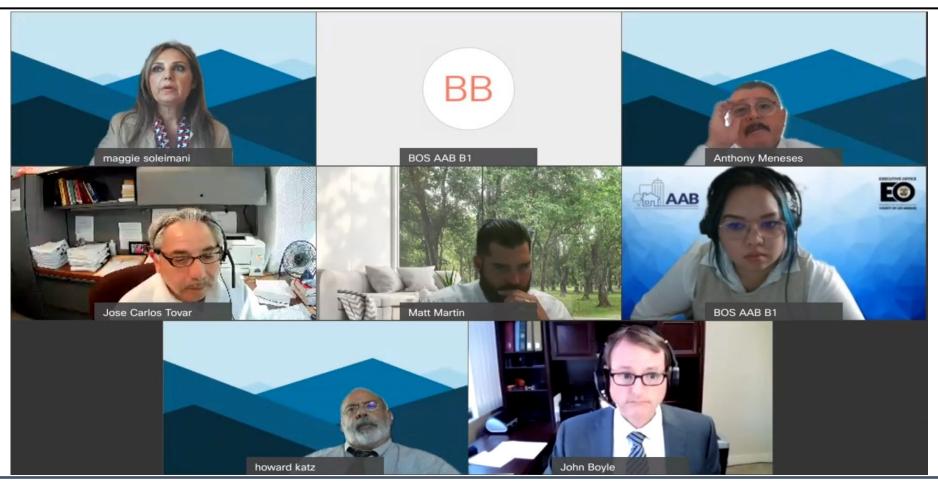
SAMPLE VIRTUAL HEARINGS- REDIRECT OF TESTIFYING APPRAISER





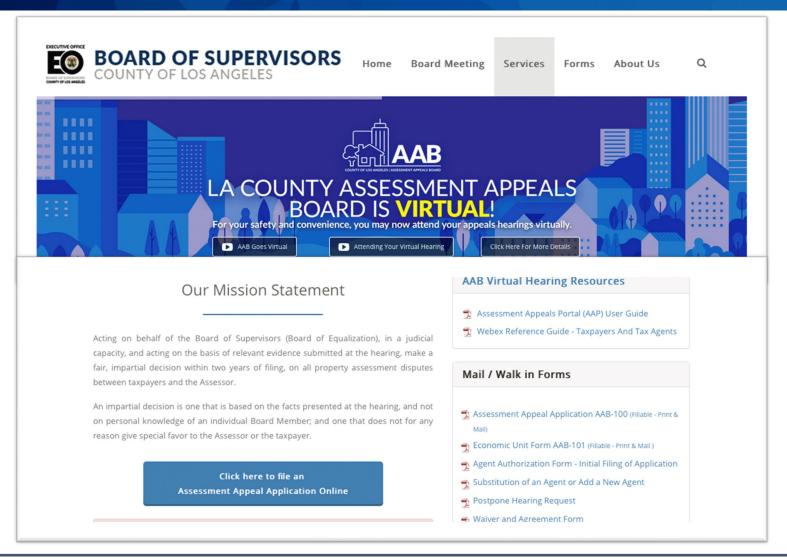


SAMPLE VIRTUAL HEARINGS- REBUTTAL
