Re: March 22, 2023, Board Meeting Item L.2. – Agenda Structure Update

Background

The purpose of the Public Agenda Notice is to clearly inform the public of the Board's business and facilitate public engagement. Under the Bagley Keene Open Meetings Act an elected state body is required to allow members of the public to attend and participate as fully as possible in a state body's discussions and decision-making processes. (Gov. Code section 11120; 103 Ops. Cal. Atty. Gen. 42). Thus, the agenda notice requirements are based on state policy that the people must be informed so they can keep control over their government.

The current Board Meeting Public Agenda Notice (PAN) template is a static document organized by alphabetic letter (letter A through O) with the same corresponding topics month to month regardless of whether the matter will be considered during a meeting. For example, the first item on every PAN is "A. Special Taxes Appeals". If there is no appeal for the month, the item is listed as "A. Special Taxes Appeals Hearings with the notation "(None Scheduled)". The PAN in use today was designed before the Board modernized their public meetings to allow virtual participation by the public and stakeholders.

Under the direction of Executive Director, the Board Proceedings Division (BPD) researched agendas from local and statewide bodies to review examples of modern agenda formats. My office also conducted a similar review. Based on the reviews and the duties and responsibilities of the Board of Equalization, I propose changes to Board's Public Agenda Notice to reflect our modernization efforts and to provide further clarity to the public we serve. However, I am open to your input and any additional suggestions your may have during our discussion of this matter.

Proposed Recommendations:

1. The recommendation is for BOE to separate the Notice and the Agenda.

The PAN is comprised of two items combined on one single document:

- a. Notice: Informs the public of the date, time, and location of the meeting, how to participate in the meeting, reasonable accommodation, etc.
- b. Agenda: Details the work of the Board including constitutional matters.

Currently, any time an update or change is made to the agenda, a completely new updated PAN is issued. This often causes confusion by the public as to whether the day and time of the meeting has changed. Separation of these items into separate documents will provide clarity and ensure the public is aware of the Board's business. Our extensive research of the Notice and Agendas for other state agencies, including the Franchise Tax Board, and elected bodies such as county board of supervisors, revealed that these items separated.

The existing format and verbiage of the 'notice' will remain the same and will be posted on the Board's Website at the same time as the agenda is posted. If an agenda is later updated, then only the agenda will need to be revised and re-posted to the website. It should be noted that separating the notice from the PAN, meets Bagley-Keene requirements.

2. The recommendation is that all matters before the Board on the existing Board Meeting Agenda Template remain, but a change in how these matters are organized and the means of identification of each item is suggested.

BOE uses a Board Meeting Agenda Template to identify and organize the matters brought to the Board of Equalization. Under the new plan, each monthly agenda would be organized using a numerical sequence and the following nine (9) sections:

- Call to Order
- Public Comments on Matters Not on the Agenda
- Consent Agenda
- Tax Program Matters
- Chief Counsel Matters
- Executive Director's Reports
- Board Member Matters and Initiatives
- Public Policy Hearings
- Closed Session

Guidelines previously adopted as "L-Board Member Matters" and "M-Public Policy Matters", will placed toward the end of every agenda, but be organized differently on the template using the sections "Board Member Matters and Initiatives" and "Public Policy Hearings".

A Board Meeting Agenda organized by topic and number allows a consecutive listing of only those items before the Board. This change means that a topic without any business would not be listed or numbered. This allows the public to easily understand the items to be discussed. For example, if there are no Special Taxes Appeals Hearings scheduled, then there would be no mention of this item on the agenda under *Tax Program Matters*.
